## CHILD BEHAVIOR

**3 Years** Things quite down briefly at 3 for most children. 2 1/2 loves to resist, 3 loves to conform. 2 1/2 said "no" - 3 is "yes". People are important. He likes to make friends. Such words as "new", "different", "big", "surprise" and "secret" all suggest a new awareness - a big horizon. Such words as "help", "might", "could" and "guess" are active motivators to get him to perform necessary tasks.

**3 1/2 Years** A period of marked insecurity, disequilibrium, uncoordination, stumbling, fear of heights, stuttering, eye crossing, can't see, can't hear, bites nails, picks nose, tries to masturbate, sucks thumb, crying, whining and frequent questioning, "Do you love me?".

**4 Years** "Out of Bound". He kicks, he hits, he throws stones, he breaks things, he runs away, he tried to shock. He has loud silly laughter and he has fits of rage. Bathroom and elimination words come into common usage. He loves to defy, (but he can be very sweet and helpful).

**4 1/2 Years** Begins to pull in from his out of bounds. He is trying to sort out what is real from what is make believe. Four year olds are great discussers. They want to know about the front and back, inside and outside. They may draw a picture of a man on one side of the paper, then turn it over and draw the back of his head on the other.

**5 1/2 Years** "He's too good", reliable, stable and well adjusted.


